Steps Toward Completing Pilot Course



Getting Ready

Educator:

- Accept course invitation to enroll in private cohort
- Review course materials and identify what content is relevant to your students
- Consider ways to recruit students and motivate active participation

Student:

Accept course invitation to enroll in private cohort

Plan and Implement

Educator:

- Define format you will use to provide the course
 - Set it and forget it: students work independently
 - Flipped classroom: use portions of the online course and discuss the content in a group setting
 - Other (virtual teacher, hybrid of styles)
- Complete the precourse survey to outline implementation details
- Submit student roster to <u>Belinda.Platt@Yale.edu</u> to invite students to the course

Student:

- Complete the precourse survey
- Begin the course and take advantage of lesson videos, quizzes, discussion forums, readings, and references





Complete Course and Beyond

Educator:

- Complete the course
- Submit postcourse feedback survey
- Remind students about relevant deadlines and due dates
- Encourage others to enroll in the public version of the course

Student:

- Complete the 6-module course or review select course materials as instructed.
- Submit postcourse feedback survey
- Verify completion with educator as needed
- Encourage others to enroll in the public version of the course
